In this Sunday's Gospel we hear of the well-known verse from the Bible, "the harvest is plenty, but the labourers are few". In farming terms, a harvest is when the crops are ready to be gathered. We know our own farmers here in Australia were throwing away good crop recently, and there was substantial waste, because there were not enough labourers to pick the produce from their farms. In terms of the Gospel, the harvest refers specifically to the vast number of people ready or needing to hear and receive the Word of God in their lives. Yet, this opportunity goes to waste. The lives of numerous people crumble around us as they struggle to deal with life and all its trials on their own, without God. Jesus reminds us that there are too few labourers to help these people hear and live out life in the context of a relationship with God.


When we look at Bible verses before this one, we see that Jesus was going around teaching and proclaiming the Gospel to others, and healing the sick and afflicted. He looks at the masses of people that follow him – and he feels sad, he feels sorry for these people. It is then that he says, with compassion in his voice, "the harvest is plenty but the labourers are few".

In a broader sense, the harvest refers to the needs of those around us. Not only the needs of those who yearn to know God, but those suffering, those who are sick, those who need our help. Jesus says there are many people around with such needs but few people are willing to help. There are few labourers ready and willing to take the Word of God to people who are yet to know Jesus, few who are willing to sit with the grieving, few willing to help the hungry and lonely. Few who are willing to keep company with the sick of mind and body. These are the labourers to whom Jesus refers. This is the harvest to which Jesus refers. We are the labourers that can help God harvest the crop of people in dire need.

On June 29, we hold a Leadership Summit for Ministry Coordinators. These coordinators are involved in running various Ministries and programs in our parish, such as the Reader's Ministry, Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, music ministries for Mass, as well as those setting up for Mass, and cleaning the Church. Then we have coordinators of the Hospitality and Social Committee Ministry which enable people to feel welcomed and included when they come to church; the Pastoral Care Ministry which gives Communion to those who are not able to come to church; Alpha and Prayer Group Ministries which encourage us to grow in a relationship with God; Legion of Mary and Soup Van Ministries that reach out to the those in need, as well as those managing the finances and the Parish Office. These Ministry Coordinators and all the Ministry members do a fabulous job in serving the parish and serving each of us, enabling us to practise our faith, and to be involved in the parish community.

Yet, there is much to be done, much more that we can initiate, more people we can help. Those who give of their time, give generously and willingly but we still need more help in some Ministries and help from others perhaps to start new Ministries, so that together we can bring about the Vision we have for our parish – to be a welcoming and dynamic faith-filled Catholic community, living and sharing the Gospel, to set the world ablaze.
